**Building**

Trust has developed world class infrastructure for the pharmacy college so that all the students can feel free to take active part in day-to-day academic activities at the college. The total constructed area of the multi storied building is about 4821.0 Sq M. For Centralized Admission: Passed HSC (Std.XII) Examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary & Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination with subjects English, Physics, Chemistry & Biology/Mathematics with 45% marks (40% backward class candidates from Maharashtra) appeared for the Maharashtra Pharmacy Common Entrance Test (MHT-CET 2020) conducted by competent Authority and Non-Zero score in subjects Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics/Biology added together at MHT-CET 2020.

For admission under institute level: Eligibility is same as above. Admission will be strictly as per the merit list of the candidates.

The students who do not have the minimum required attendance of 80% of actual lecture periods conducted, or who do not show satisfactory progress will not be allowed to appear for final examinations.

Periodic tests/seminars conducted in each semester are compulsory.

**Leave and absence:**

Student remaining absent is required to submit a leave application immediately duly countersigned by the parent / guardian.

The parent / guardian of the students are kept informed about the attendance and performance of the student. The co-operation of the parent/guardian in correcting the drawbacks of his/her ward is imperative.

**Discipline:**

Every student is responsible to the college and should take utmost care of the college premises and property.

Any damage done to the property of the college is to be compensated either individually or collectively.

Any damage to the college building furniture and fixtures by the students shall be treated as breach of discipline.

#### **Schedule of the Course:**

In order to obtain the B. Pharm / M. Pharm Degree candidate is required to pass eight / four semesters, respectively. All the examinations will be conducted by University of Mumbai. There is periodic test in each semester for theory as well as for practical.

To ensure uniform attention of the students to their work throughout the course of their study, the marks at each of the above-mentioned examinations are awarded jointly on the basis of the semester examination (75%) and periodic tests (25%).

To pass each semester, the candidate must obtain at least:

50 % of marks in each theory head

50% of marks in each practical head and

50% of total marks assigned to whole examination.

Degree will be awarded to the candidates who have passed all eight semesters.

## **Regulation for Diploma in Pharmacy**

### **Admission to the Course/Programme**

A candidate shall not be admitted to the course/programme of Diploma in Pharmacy (part I of the course/programme) affiliated by the Board, unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination or an equivalent examination as prescribed by the competent authority for admission to the course/programme in the state of Maharashtra and fulfills the other conditions prescribed for the admission to the course/programme.

### **Examinations**

There shall be two examinations, Diploma in Pharmacy, (Part-I), to examine candidates in the first year course/programme and Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-II), to examine candidates in the second year course/programme. Each examination may be held twice every year. The first examination in a year shall be the Annual examination and second examination shall be supplementary examination of the Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-I) or Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-II), as the case may be. The examination shall be of written and Practical (including oral) nature as indicated in the table in the regulation 10 of the Education Regulation 91 framed by the Pharmacy Council of India.RP-3

### **Eligibility for Award of Diploma in Pharmacy**

A candidate to be eligible for award of Diploma in Pharmacy shall have to pass  
Diploma in Pharmacy Part-I (First year) and  
Diploma in Pharmacy Part-II (Final year)  
Consisting of the course of study given in chapter II of the Education Regulation - 91, prescribed by Pharmacy Council of India.  
Diploma in Pharmacy (Part-III)  
Consisting of Practical Training and the Certificate of having completed satisfactorily the apprenticeship period as provided in Chapter III of the Education Regulation - 91 prescribed by the Pharmacy council of India.

### **Teaching and Examination Scheme**

The teaching and examination scheme of Diploma in Pharmacy shall be as prescribed under chapter II of the Education Regulation, 91 of Pharmacy Council of India and adopted by the Board, subject to such revision and modification made from time to time by Pharmacy Council of India.

The examination in various subjects/courses may include

- i. Theory
- ii. Practical (by using software – wherever applicable) including sessional examinations as per Educational Regulation 1991 and ER 1996.

### **M.Pharm (Pharmaceutical Quality Assurance)**

In semester I Learners of all branches will take 5 subjects irrespective of their area of specialization in M. Pharm. The Evaluation pattern for every subject will be 20 marks for continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and 80 marks for the end semester examination. The 20 marks for CIA will be divided into 5 marks for Attendance and 15 marks for a sessional test held mild semester.

Every will deliver a Seminar. This will be evaluated at the college level by a committee consisting of the Principal and faculty of the department in which the student will be doing his research work.

In second semester, there will be one common paper (Biostatistics and Research Methodology) and a practical (Experimental Technique in Pharmaceutical Science) for all the branches of specialization. Each branch of specialization will also have two core subjects in the branch of specialization and two choice-based subjects that may be selected from the list of Choice based subjects specified in the syllabus.

The ESE in the experimental technique in Pharmaceutical science will be conducted by the college/institution on behalf of the university.

### **Industrial Training and Placement:**

As per the curriculum one month training program for third year B. Pharm students is arranged in various pharmaceutical companies.

Industrial visits are also organized for the students.

Campus interviews are also arranged for Final Year B. Pharm students.
